THE FILIBUSTERS—EMIGRATION FROM THE ISLAND—TROUBLE AT TRINIDAD.

HAVANA, June 9.—The fact is now established beyond a doubt that the filibusters who landed in the Bay of Nipe have effected a junction with the forces of General Quesada. The troops have had several skirmishes with the insurgents recently near Trinidad. The city of Havana is quiet. The emigration of Cubans from the island has begun again. The volunteer commission met yesterday, but adjourned without taking any action. It is reported that Minister Roberts has telegraphed from Washington to the authorities at Havana warning them of their precarious condition. Advices from Trinidad have been received. A revolutionary movement was on foot at that place. The volunteers had attempted to depose the Governor, who resisted and was killed. General Lesca, with the Basque volunteers, had gone to Cinco Villas. The Nuevitas railroad has again been cut. The government has received information that two slave ships are expected here.
