

THE CUBAN REVOLUTION.

HAVANA, Aug. 12.—Mr. Coalts, a relative of the American consul at Sagua, has been arrested and sent to Havana.

Four hundred colored soldiers have left in the Spanish merchant steamer Barcelona, for Nuevas. The same men composed a portion of the last Spanish expedition to Mexico.

Advices from Puerto Principe represent the garrison abundantly supplied with provisions. Skirmishes are reported at San Espiritu, Villa Clara and Trinidad, in which the Spanish troops were successful.
