CUBANS ON CUBAN AFFAIRS.

The leading Cubans who visit Washington seem to be pretty well satisfied with the situation of things; they profess to have reports of insurgent victories in the island, and say their cause is gaining ground there constantly. They were at one time somewhat troubled about Spanish gunboats building in New York, but are now convinced that they will not be allowed by our government to go to Cuban waters; finally, they express a decided belief that General Sickles is instructed to act at Madrid in the interest of free Cuba, though they do not state the exact form of his instructions.
