NEW YORK, Jan. 23.

Last night was the coldest this winter.

The Poles of this city celebrated the anniversary of their last revolution last evening by a banquet, speeches, etc.

Colonels Augustin, Castellanos, Ricardo, Pimentel and Capts. Lorenzo, Jervinez, Elardo, Tricoto and Jose Antonio Caltra, of the insurgent army of the Island of Cuba, are at the Metropolitan Hotel, where they arrived yesterday. They have come here to advance the interests of the revolutionary cause of Cuba.
