## FROM CUBA.

Singular Proclamation from Dulco's Commissioner to the Insurgents-Aid Tendered the Government by the Clergy, &c., &c.

NEW YORK, March 7. The following is a special dispatch to the Hereld:

HAVANA, March 6. A proclamation dated at Nassau, N. P., and signed by Jose De Armas, Gen Dulce's Commissioner to the insurgents, has recently appeared. It is full of blace invective against the Spanish Governmont and against Dulce personally, placing that gentleman in the position of accusing himself of the mo-t contemptible actions.

Rederigues Corra, a companion of Commissioner Armas, publishes a card to-day in the Diacto, wherein he expresses a belief that the card is a torgery, and saving that if it were genuine the statements of Armas are false and his corduct infamous.

The clergy have offered the Government one-sixth of their income to defray the ex-

pense of the war against the insurgents.

Gon. Dulce is recruiting a regiment of volunteers for active service.

Two hundred pounds of gunpowder have been found secreted in the house of a Mrs. Terry, in this city.

Late Clenfuccos papers say there is plenty of blockade running into the interior of that place.

Information from Puerto Principe states that the insurgent General Quesada is ill with small nox.
