
CUBAN RECOGNITION.—The Washington correspondent of the *New York World*, writing on Friday last, says:

In the Cabinet session to-day there was a further discussion of the Cuban recognition question, and it is understood that the position of Secretary Fish was acquiesced in, viz.: that this Government must maintain for itself the doctrine it exacted from foreign nations during the war regarding the recognition of the rights of belligerents. The Cuban insurrection, therefore, will neither be recognized by the President nor Congress, the efforts of General Banks and the Cuban lobby to the contrary notwithstanding.
