NEW YORK, May 8.—The Spanish Consul, in an interview with United States Marshal Harlow, this afternoon, stated that he had received positive information that a steamer and several small sailing vessels are being fitted out, to take volunteers and arms to the Cuban insurgents. He demanded that such expeditions be stopped. He also called the Marshal's attention to the various recruiting stations of Cubans in this city, and formulated a list of them.

The Marshal, yesterday afternoon, received orders from Secretary Fish to prevent any possible breach of the neutrality laws in relation to Cuba.

The chief officer of the steamer Quaker City denies, on his honor as an officer and a gentleman, that her owners have the slightest intention of sending her to Cuba, or even to the West Indies.
