Progress of the Revolution.

HAVANA, February 24.—A transport arrived from Spain with six hundred chasseurs.

The Voice of Cuba newspaper calls attention to the law which makes foreigners who have resided five years in Cuba subjects of Spain, and says they must submit to the condition or leave the island.

An expedition left La Guanja for Puerto Principe. A determined fight is anticipated on the road.

Twelve persons who landed on the Cuban coast from Rota Rio have been taken prisoners. One was a Mexican.

Advices from Santiago to the 19th inst. state that cane grinding has commenced on ten out of eighty plantations in that jurisdiction. On the idle plantations there were neither laborers nor cattle to do the work.

Advices from Manzanillo to the 20th, report that the insurgents attacked a convoy at Yara. Accounts of the conflict are so contradictory that it is impossible to obtain the result.

The resignation of the American Consul at Trinidad has been accepted.

News from Kingston, Jamaica, to the 13th, states that Cubans were arriving in Jamaica in large numbers.

The Colonial Government proposes to introduce coolies to work on all old plantations now reviving.

Gen. Pucrallo, formerly of the Spanish army, in Dominica, left yesterday for Cienfuegos, to take command of the regulars in that place.

The announcement that Gen. Cabellora de Roda is to succeed Gen. Dulce as Captain General produces great excitement here.

The steamer Cricket, which is known to have left Charleston for Havana, on the 8th inst., has not arrived at this port, and it is presumed she has landed a cargo of supplies for the insurgents, somewhere on the Cuban coast.

The insurgents remain in the neighborhood of Cienfuegos. Their main body is around Villa Clara, while a large force occupies Manecaragua. The Government is forwarding all available troops to Cienfuegos and other menaced towns. The journals here do not publish the report of Gen. Cabellero de Roda's appointment.
