Rough on Barlow—Anti-Imperialist Movement— Celebration of the Fourth—National Real Estate Rusiness—The Markets.

NEW YORK, July 3.

The Cuban expedition prisoners, at the Navy Yard, have passed resolutions thanking Admiral Gordon and his officers for their kindness, and censuring Marshal Barlow for declining the responsibility for them after the capture.

An organization has been formed to oppose the movement toward imperialism in America, and compel the discontinuance of the "Imperialist" newspaper. Several city politicians are in the organization.

Extensive preparations have been made for the celebration of the Fourth in New York and vicinity. Great numbers of people have gone to the country, every train and boat being densely crowded.

It is confidentially stated that General Sickles has authority to offer one hundred million dollars for Cuba, including all the immovable property of the Spanish Government on the island. Several members of the Cuban Junta say the Spanish Minister has been notified to open negotiations for the sale of Cuba, as it is impossible to hold control over it much longer.
