The telegraphic report of Tuesday forenoon brings a fearfully botched account of some resolutions passed by the Tammany Democrats in regard to the Cuban insurrection and the attitude maintained by the Administration in regard to this and other matters of foreign policy. Out of the mass of truculent phrases that have smashed into each other in coming over the wires, we gather that the Tammany Democrats were excessively indignant because the Administration has not espoused the Cuban cause and kicked the Spaniards out of the "ever faithful isle," and further expressed the opinion that had a Democrat been at the head of affairs things would have assumed a different aspect. They also held that the treatment of Irish Americans by Great Britain constitutes a cause of belligerency superior to the differences arising from the Alabama claims or the conferring belligerent rights on the Southern rebels. Governor Hoffman wrote a letter in consonance with those views.
