The Cubans are taking fresh courage since the recog-

nition of their belligerency by Peru and Chili, and the prespect is that they will fit out several expeditions under cover of the Peruvian flag. They have opened a recruiting office at 218 Hudson street, and are cugaging men for artillery service, under a promise of \$40 per month in gold, during the time they are in service, and \$500 bounty, as soon as the Cubins obtain their independence. They are negotiating for a quantity of Remington and other breech-loading rifles, and from some source they have taised a handsome amount of capital, on which to put through their schancs. Yesterday they were negotiating for two steamers, one a screw and the other a paddle vessel, which can carry a large number of men, and run at a good speed. The city is full of Spanish spies who are watching the operations of the Cubans, and frying their best to chickmate them.
