

The Cuban Revolution.

NEW YORK, March 15—The Evening Mail has advices from Cuba, via Nassau, that General Lesca has failed three times to make his way to Puerto Principe, the insurgents having each time repulsed him, with heavy loss, before his arrival at Los Paredones, ("The Big Walls,") the most difficult pass of the mountains.

Eighty of his wounded had just arrived per steamer at Neuvas, from La Guasaca, his base, and another steamer left for Havana the same day, with a greater number.

General Lesca remains with his column between La Guasaca and Los Paredones, in a dangerous position.

Puerto Principe is besieged by the insurgents, if it is not entirely in their possession.
