The Cuban Revolution.

NNW YORK, March 15—The Evening Mail has advices from Cuba, via Nassau, that General Lasca has failed three times to make his way to Puerto Principe, the insurgents having each time repulsed him, with heavy loss, before his arrival at Las Paredones, ("The Big Walls,") the most difficult pass of the mountains.

Eighty of his wounded had just arrived per steamer at Neuvitas, from La Guoscaga, his base, and another steamer left for Havana the came day, with a greater number.

General Lesca remains with his column between La Guoreaga and Los Paredones, in a dangerous position.

Puerto Principo is besieged by the insurgents, if it is not entirely in their possession.
