

## **PROGRESS OF THE CUBAN REVOLUTION.**

**HAVANA, October 12.**—Captain General De Rodas was taken sick yesterday, but is better to-day.

General skirmishes have recently taken place in the Eastern Department, during which thirty insurgents were killed. The Spanish loss is not given.

A fight occurred near Santa Esparita between the forces of Spain and Cuba. The Spanish Colonel O'Daly was wounded. The Cubans lost 27 killed.

The municipal corporations in various parts of the island are sending De Rodas their adhesion to the existing order of things, together with expressions of loyalty to Spain.
