Progress of the Cuban Revolution

Insurgents Reported Captured and Executed.

An Insurgent General Killed in a Skirmish.

HAVANA, March 22.

In a skirmish near Trinidad, the rebel General Schmidt was killed. Two more plantations in that jurisdiction were destroyed by the rebels.

A journal here reports Mancargua and Port Heno, Galena, burned by order of Cavada. Ponce reports twenty-five insurgents mostly of high rank in the rebel army captured and executed within five leagues of Trinidad, but adds that the situation in that quarter is more serious than has heretofore appeared.

The *Echo* newspaper, of Matanzas, professes to have received intelligence that Florencio Jivineury, a rebel general, has presented himself to the Spanish authorities to receive pardon. He says that other leading members of the revolutionary Junta at Villa Clara, will follow his example provided their lives be spared, and they be guaranteed a safe conduct to some port from whence they may sail from the Island.

Haytien dates of the 8th inst., state that Salnave was defeated by the revolutionists, with loss of one hundred men and eight cannons.

St. Domingo dates of the 10th state that Gen. Sapron and others arrived off Porto Plata. The authorities threatened to shoot them if they landed. They proceeded to St. Maria, where they remained at last accounts.
