

Annexation and the Revolution in Cuba.

A Washington special to the Richmond Dispatch says :

Intelligence has reached this city from an authentic source that the Spanish Government is favorably inclined to transfer the Island of Cuba to the United States, and that the terms suggested are such as would probably meet with favor by our Government, and such of our readers as approve of the purchase and annexation of Cuba. The conditions upon which Spain would part with the Island have not transpired.

The insurgents, it is learned, however, are confident of shortly gaining entire possession of Cuba, and claim to have now secure possession of more than one-half of the island. They assert that their strength and status is such as to warrant their recognition by this Government as belligerents.
