

Last Evening's Dispatches.

FROM HAVANA.

NEW YORK, Feb. 24.

An Havana dispatch says that great excitement exists there relative to the announcement that two ironclads were at Key West. Dulce's address says that military courts are established and their decisions will be carried out. Three thousand Spanish troops are to leave Havana to-day for the interior of Cuba. Thirty-six sugar cane fields in one district and whole plantations in others have been burned by the insurgents. An expedition of 2,500 men has sailed from Neuvas to operate against the rebels at Guraja and Puerto Principe. A new export duty is hereafter to be levied upon the products of the island, in order to increase to the revenue so as to meet the extraordinary expenses of the war.
