FROM HAVANA.

HAVANA, March 19.

The insurgents have burned five of the largest plantations in the jurisdiction of Sagua Lachica, one near Cienfuegos, and another near Manicargua. It is reported that the insurgent generals are carrying out their plan of burning everywhere. A detachment of insurgents had left Alvarez well mounted, to burn plantations in the vicinity of Jabacoca. The planters are terrified. The insurgents admit that many plantations have been burned within a week.

Another steamer has arrived from Spain with troops. Generals Buceta and Escalanto were passengers. The troops have gone to Nuevitas.

An engagement took place between troops and insurgents yesterday near Alvarez. The insurgents were routed, and, dividing, one force fied toward Manicargua and the other towards Jaguey Grande.

An engagement had taken place at Guarajabulla. The official account reports 136 insurgents killed. The insurgents are active near Bolondonon. Troops from Matanzas have gone there.

When the battle of Cubita was fought Quesada was sick with the small-pox. O. tega commanded. The insurgents are carrying off slaves from plantations and making them soldiers. The number of insurgents in Sagua and Remedies districts is estimated at from 7,000 to 9,000.

The Espira plantations, near Trinidad, have been burned. The five places burned in the Sagua district produced 5,000 hogsheads of sugar annually.

Order is being restored in the jurisdiction of Cubita. Gen. Fuello is moving towards Puerto Principe. The situation at Cienfueges is unchanged. The disturbed condition of the sur rounding country provents sugar from reaching Cienfueges.
