

CUBAN AFFAIRS.

HAVANA, March 2.

A report is in circulation that all political prisoners will be sent to Fernandina Po, and that volunteers are being enlisted to act as guards on board the transports. The Government is silent upon the subject.

Francisco Hernandez, commander of the cavalry in the district of Pinar del Rio, has been placed in jail on a charge of disloyalty.

Official information is received of three engagements of the troops under Col. Valero with the insurrectionists, during which the troops used the bayonet freely. The insurgents lost sixty killed, and the troops four killed and several wounded.

The forces under Gen. Letona have arrived at Villa Clara, and those under Gen. Pacz at Cienfuegos.

The rebels have burned the San Miguel plantation.

The DIARIO says that an engagement took place at Magury, in which the insurgents were defeated, with a loss of twenty killed and many wounded. The troops lost two killed and several wounded.
