It is represented that a Spanish war steamer has captured a schooner laden with arms for the insurgents on the south side of the island.

The GAZETTE publishes the details of the orgauization of the rural police, made by the re-

quest and at the expense of the planters.

The crew of the Mary Lowell have been released. They state that the vessel was seized by a Spanish man-of war, within a mile of the shore.

The United States steamer Penobscot has arrived here from the south coast of the island.

She was relieved by the Nipsic.

The authorities are well aware of the movements of the reported expedition under General Steadman.
