

FROM HAVANA.

NEW YORK, April 17.

An Havana dispatch says that the schooner Mary Lowell has been taken to the arsenal, and her cargo been discharged. The deposition of her crew has been sent to the British Government.

Secretary Fish has telegraphed to Vice Consul-General Hall, requesting him to forward the details of the recent Spanish outrage upon the American flag in taking off two passengers from the schooner Lizzie Mayor.

An extensive campaign in the central department is inaugurating troops and is hurrying forward the Spanish war steamer Warrior, cruising on the south side of the island, and watching for expeditions from the United States.

Captain General Dulce has promulgated a decree laying an embargo on the property of absent Cubans.

Advices from Neuvas, dated the 10th inst., reports that the insurgents in the eastern department as having concentrated their forces and are advancing upon Halgin, which they are sanguine of capturing.

About 17,000 persons, including refugees and others, together with a considerable supply of stores and munitions have gathered at this point, and Gen. Benagosi, under whose command and protection they are, has called for reinforcements.

Gen. Busceta arrived to-day. In honor of the Catalonian volunteers hourly expected from Spain, arches have been erected and other preparations made for an enthusiastic reception.

The Government, to-day, seized several lots of sugar belonging to persons named in Gen. Dulce's proclamation of yesterday. Hereafter the permission of the Government will be required to enable any person to sell produce of any kind.
