

## FROM CUBA.

HAVANA, March 30, 1869,

*Herald Special.*—Troops are concentrating in the Cienfuegos District.

The war steamer, Pizarro has arrived here from Cadiz with 270 troops. The British gun-boat, Heron will return to this port to-morrow, and the British gun-boat Mullet is looked for from Jamaica.

The American consul at Jamaica was carefully watching the movements of the Mt. Vernon.

The British Minister at Port au Prince had made representations to his government, complaining that the agents of President Salnave examined the mails on the steamer Cuban, breaking seals of letters, and the information thus obtained led to many arrests, and to the execution of two persons.

Two British men-of-war have gone to Port au Prince, to demand reparation, and it is probable that serious results will ensue.

Innocencio Casanova, a citizen of the United States, has been arrested on suspicion of complicity in the plot for the seizure of the steamer *Comanditario*.

The United States steamer *Narragansett* sailed for Key West to coal. She will return in a few days.

A gang of negroes on the Manuelita plantation, near Cienfuegos, have joined the rebels. Troops are pursuing them.

Four hundred militia and cavalry left to-day for Cienfuegos.
