

CUBAN NEWS.

NEW YORK, May 11.

A Washington special says that the Spanish minister received, last night, a submarine cable dispatch from General Dulce, announcing the final suppression of the rebellion in Cuba. It is asserted by Dulce that only 1,200 insurgents are under arms, and they are in detached bodies, without leaders or concert of action.

The news was submitted to the State Department. It does not receive great credit here, and is supposed to be promulgated to discourage American sympathy with Cuba, and deter filibustering schemes.

Cubans here affirm the ability of their countrymen to hold out against the Spaniards for an indefinite time. They claim that the armed bodies alleged to be wandering around constitute the nucleus of forces to the number of eight or ten thousand men, working on farms and plantations, that can be concentrated at any time to strike a decisive blow.
