

## FROM HAVANA.

HAVANA, May 11.

The DIARIO to-day publishes a meager report of an engagement which took place between the Spanish troops, under command of General Le ca, and the Cuban insurgents, at Alta Gracia. The report says that the rebels offered a more determined resistance than in any previous battle, and acknowledges that the Spaniards lost a colonel, a captain, and six privates killed and thirty wounded. It claims that the rebel losses were heavy, but does not give the number.

The insurgents have burned the village of San Miguel, near Nuevitas.

Puerto Principe is reported to be plentifully supplied with provisions.

It is expected that the PRENSA, of this city, will soon suspend publication, and probably withdraw entirely from the field.

The steamer Columbia arrived at noon to-day from New York with Mr. Plum, the new consul of the United States for Havana, as passenger.
