

FILIBUSTERING.

NEW YORK, June 28.

There is little additional information as to the frustrated Cuban expedition. The men who were to have gone on the Catharine Whitney are probably in hiding on Long Island and up North River.

Rumor says that another expedition is being fitted out in Long Island Sound. The rendezvous is said to be in the vicinity of Lloyd's Neck.

Other reports say the Catharine Whitney's expected passengers were landed at some point to prevent straggling, and in the hope that another vessel would be ready to take them to-night. Marshal Barlow has taken steps to ascertain their hiding-place and prevent the departure of any hostile expeditions in future. The Whitney is closely watched by two revenue-cutters.

Drs. McNulty and Dubois, indicted for connection with the Cuban expeditions, have been set at liberty on their own recognizance.
