THE PRIVATEER CUBA.

The Stenmer Libeled-A Refusal to Sursender to the Civil Power-An Officer of the Navy Receives Commodore Hig. gins' fiword-The Crew Turned Loose. WILMINGTON, N. C., Oct. 19.—The Cuba was libeled to-day, and the United States Marshal boarded her and demanded the surrender of the ship into his hands. Commodore Higgins declined to surrender his ship except to an offioer of the United States Navy, and under a direct order from President GRANT. After some delay Lieutenant-Commander Pierson, of the United States gunboat Frolle, came on board the Cuba and domanded the surrender of the vessel, showing an order direct from the President for the Cuba to be turned over to him. Commodore Higgins then surrendered his sword and vessel to Lieutenant-Commander Pirason, and himself as prisoner of war to the navy of the United States. The Cuban flag was then hauled down by the United States authorities, and the entire crow sont ashore. The affair, in some of its aspects is regarded here as an outrage, especially the turning loose in our city of over one hundred sallors and marines, entirely beyond restraint or control of officers. In anticipation of trouble a large special Police force has keen put on duty to-night.
