The action of the United States authorities in regard to the *Cuba*, at Wilmington, N. C., causes, it is said, great satisfaction at Havana. The Spanish troops recently arrived in Cuba are to leave immediately for the seat of war. Considerable sickness is reported on the eastern end of the Island.

A letter has been received at Washington from Nassau, N.P., in which the writer states that the Cuban privateer *Lillian*, under the changed name of the *Céspedes* and flying the Cuban colors, had been seized as a pirate near that port by a British ship of war. The report is not yet confirmed.
