The Havana Press disagree in opinion in regard to the recent decree establishing religious liberty in the Spanish colonies. The Vox de Cuba praises the action of the Cortes; the Diario morely refers to the decree without comment, while the Prensa expresses dissatisfaction but accepts the situation.

In answer to a dispatch from Havana, the Colonial Minister at Madrid says that no important action in regard to social or political reforms in the colonies will be taken by the Government until those interested in them have an opportunity of being heard.

It is said that the steamer Lillian, seized pear Nassau, N. P., as an alleged Cuban privation, will not be released by the English authorities, but condemned and held as a plrate.
