Revolutionary Attack on Baracoa—Probable Surrender of the City.

By letters received from Baracoa, Cuba, dated the 6th inst., we learn that on the evening of the 5th that place was attacked at three points by a body of revolutionists. One column made the attack at Matichin, another at the fort of Seboruco on the hill, and a third along the beach. The battle continued four hours without decisive advantage to either party, and it was presumed the attack would be continued the next day, when it was probable the town would surrender.

Baracoa is the oldest city on the island and lies just north of Cape Mayal, the eastern point of Cuba. If thereto we had no intelligence of any revolutionary movements in its vicinity. Its principal foreign commerce is a large fruit trade carried on with New York.
