The conduct of Captain Higgins is a mystery to the Cubana, who say he had no reason for putting into Wilmington! his orders from the Junta were to seek Cuban waters without delay, and ample prowision had been made to supply him with coal on the voyage. A precedent for the commander of the brivateer is found in the case of Captain Semmes. of the Sumter, who, before the belligerency of the Southern States had been acknowleded by Spain. entered the port of Cienfuegos, Cubs. with his vessel and prizes, where he was received with great

consideration by the authorities and allowed to coal

and refit without interruption.
