

THE CUBAN PRIVATEER.

The Officers of the Cuba Confident of Her Release—Attempted Arrest of a Deserter—Interference of Government Officers.

WILMINGTON, Oct. 15, 1863.

The case of the sloop-of-war Cuba comes up before the United States Commissioner to-morrow, and continues to excite great interest. A marine who had deserted from the Cuba and went to New York has been brought here as a witness for the government. An attempt was made by the officers of the Cuba to arrest him to-day, but the officers of the United States gunboat Frolic claimed that he was under the protection of the United States flag and the movement was abandoned. The impression is general that the case will be again continued by the government. District Attorney Pierrepont, of New York, is expected to take part in the prosecution to-morrow. The officers of the Cuba are still confident of ultimate release,
