Spanish Account of a Recent Encounter With the Insurgents.

HAVANA, Nov. 10, 1869.

The following is the official account of the battle lately fought in the southern part of the Eastern Department:—

The Spanish troops under the command of General Mendigueren attacked the insurgents' forces between the towns of Contramaestre and Ramon. One hundred and twenty of the insurgents were killed, and large numbers wounded and taken prisoners. Among the rebels killed are General Tamaco, Captain Gouchet, Harry Clarivey, chief of staff, and William Cronstand, General Jordan's quartermaster. The insurgent forces were driven beyond the town of Palo-Picado, and the Spanish troops now occupy the positions held by the rebels during the past year. The insurgent forces under Generals Yaguas and Illipinas retreated north by way of Terahueca. Arthur Casamjor, one of the rebel leaders, was killed.

The *Bayamo Journal* says that General Maso was killed, and that the Spanish troops have captured the insurgent hospital at Ramon.
