

**SEIZURE OF THE LATE CONFEDERATE RAM AT-
LANTA**—On Monday afternoon Special Deputy
Collector Luckel and Surveyor Goodrich, of Phila-
delphia, acting under authority received from
Secretary Boutwell, repaired to the shipyard of
Messrs. Neale & Levy, and there took possession of
the ram Atlanta, for an alleged violation of the neu-
trality laws. Deputy Collector Luckel placed a

Custom House officer on board, and instructed the commanding officer of the revenue cutter Moccasin to furnish every assistance required to prevent any infringement of the neutrality laws. The Atlanta has been for some time at Messrs. Neale & Levy's yard undergoing very extensive repairs, and it has been rumored that her intentions were to help the struggling patriots of Cuba. Within the last week an armament of four 100-pounder Parrott guns has been put on board; and it is supposed that this war-like demonstration was the cause for the seizure alluded to. She is owned by parties in New York.—*Philadelphia Press*, November 9.
