Spanish Restrictions on Passports Granted to Cubans—More Atrocious Murders Committed by Spanish Troops.

We have received private correspondence from Remedios, dated October 30, from which we publish the following extracts:—General Caballero de Rodas has issued a decree that no Cubans can obtain passports to leave the "Ever Faithful Isle" for the United States, Mexico or the Archipelago of Colombia without previously giving bonds for \$5,000, taking oath that they are good Spaniards and that they will not labor for the cause of the revolution abroad. Innumerable executions are continually being made by the Spanish commanding officers, mostly on innocent persons. Among the latest victims are Don Juan Castellanos and the two sons of Don Francisco Santos, all of whom were known to be quiet and inoffensive persons, and whose only crime was their being Cubans. These murders, so our correspondent states, are kept secret from the superior authorities by the officers Messrs. Rodrigues Cobre and De Chapelgorris, by whose command they were perpetrated. Even the Spaniards who inhabit the immediate vicinity of the locality where these acts were committed could not refrain from giving vent to their indignation.
