Our Havana letter intimates that many members of the Spanish Club of that city despair of the condition of affairs in Spain and are in favor of Cuba looking after her own matters. The expedition against the Cienega de Zapara it is feared will prove anything but a success, owing to the nature of the country, which it is asserted 500 insurgents could hold against the entire Spanish army. The Captain General has relieved the officers in command of Cinco Villas for incompetency and want of energy. It is reported that 400 Spanish troops at Cinco Villas have joined the insurgents. On the 7th instant the mail steamer arrived at Havana from Porto Rico, bringing 600 troops.
