## SPAIN. Queen Isabella's Abdication—Governmental "Impossibilities." PARS. Nov. 16, 1869.

The Journal des Débals asserts that Queen Isabella has definitively abdicated the throne of Spain. Le Temps of Paris says:—

Everything is impossible in Spain now—a republic, because the republicans are insufficient; a monarch, because no party is strong enough to appoint

a king. Unless a coup d'état or a victorious revolution occurs. Spain will probably remain provisionally an irregular republic under the name of monarchy.
