THE CEISIS IN CORA.—Spain is sending over thousands of reinforcements to the army of the Captain General for the subjugation of Cuba. The Gubans have actively commenced the burning of the surgar plantations as the surest way of reaching the vulnerable heel of Spain: Both sides are ovidently impressed with the idea that if the Cubans are not concurred before

the meeting of the United States Congress the

independence of the island will follow, and we are more than half way of this opinion: The members of both houses of Congress understand the universal sentiment of this country in regard to Cubs, and when they meet we shall have some effective expression of this public sentiment. Meantime, the Spaniards

will do their best to subjugate the Cubans, but the time is short and the advantages are on

the side of Independence.
