

Death of General Dulce—Colonial Documents.

MADRID, NOV. 24, 1869.

General Dulce, recently at the head of the government in Cuba, died yesterday.

The government will soon present to the Cortes a number of documents bearing on the Cuban question.

PARIS, NOV. 24, 1869.

Private advices received here contradict positively the general impression that Italy favors the elevation of the Duke of Genoa to the Spanish throne. A despatch from Madrid, however, states that General Prim has assured the Cortes that the proposition meets with the favor of King Victor Emanuel. The Duke of Genoa now has 163 deputies pledged to his support.

The Cortes have passed a vote of thanks to M. Ferdinand de Lesseps, the President Director of the Suez Canal.

Within the past three weeks 24,000 volunteers have sailed from Spanish ports for Cuba.
