Arrival of the Crew of the Lillian at Savannah.

SAVANNAH, Dec. 20, 1863.

The United States flagship Severn, Rear Admiral Poor, of the North Atlantic squadron, arrived off Lybee Bay yesterday with the officers and crew of the Cuban privateer Lillian, who were captured by the British authorities and released. They were brought from Nassau, N. P., by the United States steamer Powhatan to Key West, and there transferred to the Severn, by which steamer they were brought to this point. The steam tug Christiana brought them to this city yesterday afternoon. This morning the City Council held a meeting and appropriated a sum of money to send the released men home. Most of them are from Northern States.
