The Spaniards don't like this, and by way of retaliation they propose to urge upon the Cantain General the policy of not allowing any more American machinery to enter the island. Good. commence by rejecting the thirty new gunboats

built in New York.

THE CUBAN SUGAR QUESTION.—The sugar
