

THE CUBAN REVOLUTION.

Expedition to Aid the Insurgents.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Feb. 12, 1869.

For some time past a number of Cuban gentlemen have been in this city under suspicious circumstances. On the 7th instant they chartered the steamer Henry Burden, giving out that she was bound for Nassau. About the same time a steamer arrived from Charleston, laden with coal, and hauled alongside the Henry Burden. The work of emptying the coal into the latter vessel was immediately commenced and continued all night, after which she went to sea, having cleared for Nassau.

It is pretty well known that the Burden has a quantity of arms and other munitions of war on board, and that large sums of money have been offered for volunteers to ship on board of her. There is no doubt that the vessel is bound for Cuba to enlist in the service of the insurgents.
