

## NAVAL INTELLIGENCE.

### Movements of United States Steamers.

The United States sloop-of-war Jamestown has arrived at San Francisco (Feb. 14) from Mare Island, having been thoroughly overhauled for a cruise on the South Pacific coast. She carries a battery of sixteen guns and has a crew of 150 officers and men, as well as a fine marine guard.

The United States steamer Lincoln is fitting out at Mare Island, Cal., for a cruise in the North Pacific, having been substituted in place of the Wyanda, which vessel is unsuited for duty on the Alaska coast.

Admiral Hoff, commanding the North Atlantic squadron, reports from Havana, 6th inst., the employment of the vessels of his squadron as follows:—Contocook (flagship), in excellent condition, at Havana, waiting for the termination of the present excitement to make a cruise around the island of Cuba; the Gettysburg at Nuevitaa, having touched at Matanzas, *en route*, and reported everything quiet there; Penobscot, arrived at Havana on the 1st, from a cruise upon the Spanish Main. The Yantic is cruising in Haytien waters. The Nipsic is at Aspinwall, having relieved the Yankee at the Isthmus.
