A despatch from Matanzas dated to-day states that the volunteers there are mobilizing. Intelligence from Trinidad to Tuesday last reports the Spanish troops to be operating in that vicinity

From Cientuegos we learn that on Wednesday last the artillery column returned to that town, having whipped the insurgents on the Darnuju river.
