**Arrival of the Narragansett at Havana—
Skirmishes in Sagua La Grande—Reports
Regarding President Grant's Views on the
Cuban Question—Havana Markets.**

HAVANA, March 9, 1869.

The United States gunboat Narragansett arrived here to-day.

Several skirmishes are reported to have taken place between the troops and insurgents within the jurisdiction of Sagua.

Many reports are in circulation regarding President Grant's views and intentions in relation to the Cuban question.

The sugar market is steady; sales were made to-day on a basis of 9½ reals per arroba for No. 12 Dutch standard. Exchange on London, 10½ a 11 per cent premium; on the United States, sixty days' sight, in gold, ¼ a 1½ per cent discount; short sight, par a ¼ per cent premium; in currency, sixty days' sight, 26 a 25 per cent discount.
