Additional Reinforcements from Spain-The Issurgents near Sagun-Fights near Nacvitas-Insurgents Advancing on Holgulo-HAVANA, March 16, 1869.

Twelve hundred additional troops have arrived today from Spain.

The insurgents in the neighborhood of Sagua is Grande number 1,500, and are under the command of an American named Rudolph Pale, formerly in the Confederate service and lately a clerk in the superstantile home of single or in Caubarien.

Advices from the interior represent that the troops are advancing against the rebels in every direction. The government officers are working hard to re-establish communication between Nueritas

and Fuerto Principo. Skirmishes have taken place at Eaca, near Knevitas, and at Foirrillo two fights within forty-eight bours are reported, in one of which, according to the government account, 175

insurgents were killed. No reports of these engagements have been received from the Cuban side. Forty rebel prisoners have arrived here from

Remedios.

The rebels who were defeated at Mayari are mov-

ing towards Holguin.
