The Villa Clara Insurgents Issuing Paper Money-Movements of United States War Vessels. HAVANA, March 17, 1889. Captain General Dulce has promulgated a decree reducing the taxes one half on all exports under the Spanish flag. In lieu of the taxes now collected on

exports under foreign flags the charges will be for sugar, seven reals per box; tobacco, \$1.75 per quintal; molasses, fifty cents per hogshead. The decree takes effect from the 1st of April next. The insurgents in the jurisdiction of Villa Clara have issued paper currency in notes of the denomination of five dollars, payable after the recognition
