Reappearance of Insurgents at Puerto Dayamo—The Troops Fortifying Mayari.

SANTIAGO DE CUBA, March 19, 1903.

There has been a report here that a band of insurgents recently reappeared at Puerto Dayamo and had fired on some volunteers, killing one, but thus far the report has not been confirmed.

The steamer Guantanamo left here on the 11th inst. for Bahia de Nipe, carrying supplies for the troops at Mayari and also two cannons. Colonel Camara is fortifying that place and will leave a garrison there. The march thither from this place was under a continuous fire from the insurgents, but with small loss. Monson, who had murdered the Spaniards, was shot by order of Peralta and not of Marmol, as reported. Marciano was the chief in command there, neither Gomez, Marmol nor Figueroa being in the vicinity.

The captain commanding the garrison of Palma Soriano advises the Governor here that a refugee told him that 6,000 insurgents were concentrating to attack that place, and, if successful, to follow by an attack on Santiago. A band of 300 rebels had appeared near Barayabo recently.
