

## **The Democrats in Congress on the Cuban Resolution.**

The vote in the House of Representatives on the Cuban resolution on Saturday last was ninety-eight to twenty-four, showing the absence of a large number of members in advance of the final adjournment of the session. Those voting in the negative were mostly democrats, but there was a fair proportion of democrats in the majority, including Mr. Brooks, of New York, who, by the way, appears to have been the only New York democrat left in the House. The vote of Mr. Brooks and the other democratic members in the affirmative is somewhat remarkable in view of the sentiments of the resolution. It says that the people of the United States sympathize with the people of Cuba "in their patriotic efforts to secure their independence and establish a republican form of government, guaranteeing the personal liberty and equal political rights of all the people," &c. This means the equal political rights of niggers, and in facing this music Mr. Brooks seems to have cast away all his objections politically to the flat nose, thick lips, woolly hair and peculiar shinbone of the nigger.
