The vote in the House of Representatives on
the Cuban resolution on Saturday last was ninety-eight to twenty-four, showing the absence

of a large number of members in advance of the final adjournment of the session. Those voting in the negative were mostly democrats,

but there was a fair proportion of democrats in the majority, including Mr. Brooks, of New York, who, by the way, appears to have been the only New York democrat left in the House.
