Arrival and Grand Reception of the Catalonian Volunteers—Two Disloyal Negroes Killed.

HAVANA, April 18, 1869.

The Catalonian volunteers arrived to-day from Spain, and were received with immense enthusiasm. On landing they were escorted to their barracks by the regular and volunteer troops, and a large civic procession, which passed through the principal streets. The city was gaily decorated and triumphal arches spanned the streets on the line of march.

Two negroes among the spectators shouted "Viva Oespedes," and were instantly killed.

The steamer Cuba arrived to-day from Baltimore.
